

A Bit of History

Charles & Emma Houston, owners of the land and the lake since 1928, developed the property for recreation and rented cabins to anglers.

To protect the lake and his investment the Houstons substantially rebuilt the dam to prevent wash-outs.

Now a popular location for fishing, people wanted to buy cabins on the lake so the Houstons plotted and subdivided the property and on June 4, 1946 formed the Venetian Gardens Home's Association and deeded the Lake to it.



Fireworks

Section 210.680 of the Houston Lake Municipal Code states:

It shall be unlawful for any person to use or discharge any “bottle rockets”.

It shall be unlawful for any person to use, ignite or discharge any fireworks within the public right of way of any public street.

Fireworks may only be used, ignited or discharged at the following times and dates:

1. From 10:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. each day during the period of June twenty-sixth (26) until July second (2nd) and on July fifth (5th); and

2. From 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. (midnight) each day on July third (3rd) and July fourth (4th).

No person shall have in his/her possession Division 1.3 (formerly class “B”) fireworks.

Division 1.4 (formerly class “C”) fireworks may be possessed during periods herein provided.

DISCHARGING AIR GUN, ETC.

Any person within the limits of this City who shall discharge any BB gun, spring gun, paint gun or air gun or shall shoot any pebble, bullet, slug, arrow or other hard substance by means of a sling, crossbow, rubber band or bow or any other means shall be deemed guilty of an ordinance violation; provided however, that this Section shall not apply to any person or organization authorized by the City of Houston Lake to possess and discharge such devices for the purpose of waterfowl pest control. (Ord. No. 303, 9-12-05 (Section 210.285))

- Must have **2021 Venetian Gardens wristband. (If you don't have your wristband contact HOA, via email).**
- Boat must be registered with HOA. (Registration form on HOA website.)
- No boats from outside of Houston Lake are allowed on the lake.
- Fish must be a live when brought to registration table.

Don't Forget Your Missouri Fishing License and a Houston Lake "2021 Wristband"!!



Lake Residents from the age of 16 through 64 need a Missouri Fishing License and a Houston Lake 2021 Wristband in order to fish in Houston Lake. Residents 65 and over need only a 2021 Wristband.

ABSOLUTELY NO FISHING IN THE BEACH AREA.

To get your 2021 Wristbands call Homes Association Treasurer, Susan Hodges @ 816.786.2377.

The Wristbands are FREE if your Homes Association dues are paid.

Guests of Residents must have that Residents 2021 Wristband with them when they are on or around the lake and on Homes Association property.

ATTENTION *Your Lake Dues must be paid to use the lake facilities for swimming, fishing, boating or other recreational purposes even if you have lake front property. Non-paying members may not picnic on Homes Association property (for example, the beach, Mayor's park or the peninsula) you must have your 2021 Lake wristband with you when using the lake*



Homes Association Rules and Regulations

1. Lake tags will be issued to lot owners who have paid their HOA dues in full. Lot owners will be responsible for the wristbands issued to their property.
2. Lake Wristband must be worn and visible for everyone on Venetian Gardens HOA property at all times.
3. Private property. No trespassing. Residents, lot owners and guests only. Violators will be prosecuted.
4. Property owners are responsible for the conduct and actions of their guest at all times.
5. No DIVING or FISHING from the Swimming Docks.
6. No swimming after 9:00p.m.
7. Alcohol will not be allowed in the beach area.
8. Animals will not be allowed in the beach area.
9. Fishing will NOT be allowed ANYWHERE beyond the gate at the swim beach.
10. No disorderly conduct.
11. All Rules and Regulations of the Missouri State Conservation Commission will apply.
12. No trot lines, jug lines or unattended fishing lines are permitted.
13. All Terrain Vehicles, motor bikes, motor cycles and motor scooters are prohibited from operating on Homes Association property.

PLEASE NOTE: *Houston Lake is dedicated to preventing the spreading of Zebra Mussels. If you want to use any watercraft on Houston Lake, it must be registered with the HOA and tagged (even if it has been in the water for years). If you wish to launch any NEW watercraft on the lake, it MUST be inspected and approved by the HOA.*

hoacommunications@houstonlake.net. *This process will take at least 10 days, so plan accordingly. You must also have 2021 lake wristband, watercraft safety equipment (life vest) and adhere to lake rules.*

This applies to NEW boaters. However, safety equipment applies to ALL boaters.

Semi-Annual Meeting
Minutes
April 21, 2021

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.

Roll Call: Mary Head

Present: Kerry Hallowell, President, Joe Briones, Vice President, Susan Hodges, Secretary/Treasurer
Mary Head, Board Member, Teresa Olson, Board Member

Introduction: Kerry welcomed Teresa Olson who is filling a vacancy resulting from Jeff Lister moving to the Lake of the Ozarks. Joe Briones is completing Jeff's term as vice president.

Treasurer's report:

Susan Hodges provided the members with annual financial statements and an overview of the income and expenses for the year to date.

Meeting:

Kerry advised the members that the Board had contacted an attorney to represent the HOA. The plan is to become more aggressive in collecting past due accounts receivable balances. The plan is to send notices to the members who disregard their responsibilities to the other members. Failure to respond to the notice will result in legal action.

Teresa and Kerry gave an update on the goose patrol. Teresa said she thought the egg laying was later this year due to the weather. She also said that they were finding a lot of broken eggs this year but could not tell what might be occurring from the way the eggs were broken. The HOA has a permit to control the goose population and follows a practice of dipping the eggs in oil.

The lake water was tested in April. The samples were collected in the beach area (but not at the dock) and in the eastern cove. The cove was tested to have a baseline to evaluate potential contamination that may result from the bridge construction. The results for E coli were 86 at the cove and 1 in the swim area, both of which are within the safe limits. The water from the swim area was also tested for fecal coliforms and resulted in a less than 1 value.

Joe talked about the upcoming fishing tournament scheduled for June 5th. Kerry added that a picnic is planned to celebrate the HOA 75th anniversary immediately following the fishing tournament.

The Board discussed possible ways of controlling the growth of duckweed on the lake, such as using fluridone, which is EPA approved, dye and grass carp. The plan is to test a small area by applying fluridone to see how effective it is.

Joe gave a presentation on his recent research on obtaining grant funds. He found that the Missouri Department of Economic Development has grants for low to medium income communities to assist with mitigating possible flooding from the lake. He suggested that removing the peninsula would lower the lake water level, which would give more volume to contain the rise of the water level during heavy rains. The first step is to see if the community is a low to medium income community and is requesting members complete a survey which is completely anonymous. The grant is a 100% grant, there is no matching required by the HOA. If the community qualifies, the Board is open to conducting a vote on the removal of the peninsula.

The meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.

Joe Briones discussed the survey and reminded members that survey sessions will be held May 25th and May 26th from 6:30 to 8:00 pm and again on Saturday from 1:00 to 3:00 pm. The meeting on May 25th may need to be rescheduled. The survey is to determine if the community is a low to medium income community that qualifies for a CDBG grant.

Teresa let everyone know that she had found at least 42 goose eggs, but she did not yet know the total number others may have found.

Joe talked about the upcoming fishing tournament scheduled for June 5th from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm and reminded members of the picnic at the beach immediately following the fishing tournament.

A member asked who is responsible for mowing an area at the beginning of the east cove. It is not known conclusively who owns it or if it is accessible to be maintained, so this is yet to be determined.

Chuck Stone gave the HOA a City update and introduced Annemarie Murphy as the new north ward alderman effective in June. He talked about the plans for the Fourth of July celebration, keeping it with the old format followed in prior years. The City of Houston Lake application for the stormwater grant was approved.

The meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.



CITY NEWS

Unfortunately, the City of Northmore would charge too much for their policing. So now our City Council is focused on arranging a new agreement with Platte County Sheriff's Department. Somehow, we'll find a way to meet the hourly increase the sheriff's department is asking.

A stormwater grant that Pam Freese and I applied for from Platte County has been approved. So. The drainage problem on Adrian Ave near city hall should be corrected soon with new grading and pavement. Before supporting the work, I coordinated with the project manager at Missouri American Water. She ensured that they will be doing a work-around for our new pavement when they begin laying new pipes. They simply switched the area from the second phase of work to the last step of the piping improvement.

At the June 14th meeting, your Alderman will be voting on a resolution to grant Missouri American Water an easement onto two parcels of land owned by the city. Scan the QR codes below to view the parcels on the Platte County Assessor's website. If you cannot scan the codes, you can simply go to the Assessor's website and search for parcels 19-9.0-32-100-002-013.000 & 19-9.0-32-100-002-008.001.



The request also includes access to lines under the streets. Susan Harris, the project manager, says that any work will probably not begin until next summer. She also says it's too early to show precisely where the digging will take place.

Chapter 230

Section 230.025. Open Burning Restrictions. [Ord. No. 176 §1, 5-9-1988; Ord. No. 336, 7-9-2012]

- A. No person shall conduct or cause or permit the conduct of open burning, except open burning for recreation purposes shall be allowed upon application and issuance of a permit by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Houston Lake. Permits will be issued at no cost to the individual. Permits are valid for the calendar year in which the permit is approved, not to exceed December thirty-first (31st) of the calendar year in which the permit is approved, and are subject to the restrictions set forth in this Section 230.025(B).
- B. Permits will be considered for open burning for recreational purposes only with the following restrictions:
1. Applicants must be at least twenty-one (21) years of age and an owner of the property in which the fire will be located.
 2. Burning shall be in a chiminea, commercially purchased fire pit, or barbecue grill. Home built fire pits must be approved by the Board of Aldermen.
 3. The location for burning shall not be less than fifteen (15) feet from any structure or combustible material.
 4. Fires shall not exceed three (3) feet in length by three (3) feet in width by three (3) feet in height and shall only be between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 12:00 P.M. Midnight.
 5. Burning shall be of untreated wood only.
 6. Burning of solid waste such as household trash is prohibited.
 7. Burning of yard waste, tires, rubber products, hazardous materials, styrofoam, plastics, petroleum-based products, demolition waste, treated wood, and asbestos-containing material is prohibited.
 8. Burning of waste generated by a business, trade, industry, salvage or demolition operation is prohibited.
 9. Burning in the street is prohibited. No open burning shall be allowed in the paved portion of any public street.
 10. Burning that is offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor emissions shall be prohibited.
 11. The permit holder shall remain in constant attendance of the fire until the fire is extinguished. A minimum of one (1) portable fire extinguisher with a minimum 4A rating or other approved on-site fire extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, water barrel, garden hose or water truck, shall be available for immediate utilization.
 12. The Mayor and Fire Chief or his designee is authorized to designate individual days as "no burn" days for recreational open burning within the City. On days designated

- as "no burn" days, all open burning is prohibited. The designation of "no burn" days shall be subject to the discretion of the Mayor and Fire Chief or his designee. Designation of "no burn" days shall be posted at Houston Lake City Hall before 9:00 A.M. of the day that is to be designated as a "no burn" day. It shall be the duty of the permit holder to determine whether a particular day is designated as a "no burn" day.
13. The permit must be kept on-site and be presented to the Fire Department official or City Official upon request.
- C. Open burning for recreational purposes is prohibited on designated "no burn" days. Open burning is also prohibited when the following conditions exist:
1. Atmospheric conditions that prevent smoke from rising freely.
 2. When excessively dry conditions exist.
 3. Sustained winds greater than fifteen (15) miles per hour.
 4. Frequent wind gusts greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour.
- D. Permits may be revoked by the Board of Aldermen should the Board of Aldermen determine that the permit holder has violated any of the conditions set forth above in Section 230.025(B).
- E. The Fire Department official or City Official is authorized to order the extinguishment by the permit holder, another person responsible, or the Fire Department of burning that creates or adds to a hazardous or objectionable situation, or of burning that is in violation of this Section.
- F. "*Open burning*", as used in this Section, means the burning of any materials in which air contaminants are emitted directly into the air without first passing through a stack or chimney.
- G. "*Untreated wood*", as used in this Section, means lumber and other wooden materials that have not been chemically treated for resistance to moisture, fire, fungi, insects and other pests or has not otherwise been treated or manufactured with chemicals, or that does not contain adhesives or resins. Untreated wood does not include plywood, particle board, chipboard or wood with other than minimal amounts of paint, coating or finish.
- H. "*Yard waste*", as used in this Section, means leaves, brush and vegetation, to include, but not be limited to, grass clippings, vines, and ivy, that originated on the property in which it will be burnt on. Yard waste does not include tree limbs that originated on the property in which it will be burnt on.
