

### Water Test taken around the Beach Area

Great Plains Analytical Laboratory tested a water sample extracted around the Beach area of Houston Lake on Monday July 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The water sample was analyzed for E. coli. Results conclude that Houston Lake is safe for swimming. **E. Coli (water) = 7\*** \*If the geometric mean of the water quality sample results does not exceed the equivalent of 190 E. coli colonies the conditions are safe for swimming. Children under 14 years of age require Adult supervision when using the beach area. This is a State Law.

***ATTENTION Your Lake Dues must be paid to use the lake facilities for swimming, fishing, boating or other recreational purposes even if you have lake front property. Non-paying members may not picnic on Homes Association property (for example, the beach, Mayor's Park, or the peninsula) you must have your 2022 Lake wristband with you when using the lake.***

## WE CLEANED MY BOTTOM!

We recently cut and removed vines, weeds, debris and brush from my property shore line. We then used metal garden rakes removing limbs, concrete with attached rebar, debris and brush to about 8 feet out. These items appear to have been on the lake bottom for years. We then made use of the HOA lake blade to remove the same elements from the lake bed to approximately 25 feet out. Cleaning your property shore line and lake Bottom is esthetically pleasing, improves property value and increases aquatic activity safety!

## ARTICLE II. PERMITS

### SECTION 500.100: BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

All persons desiring to construct, erect, alter or add to any building, boat dock, fences, road or drive or any structure in the City of Houston Lake, Missouri, must first obtain a building permit for such construction, alteration or addition from the Board of Aldermen of said City. (Ord. No. 282 §2, 10-14-02)

### SECTION 500.110: PERMIT APPLICATIONS

All persons desiring to obtain such a permit shall submit an application with the complete plans and specifications and plot plan for such construction showing sizes, estimated cost and details of such proposed construction and the location of such construction upon the plot of land. No new dwelling construction or property line fence construction will be permitted until after certified surveys have been filed with the Board of Aldermen. Certified surveys will be required on all additions to old dwellings where the new construction will be closer to the property line than the old dwelling. (Ord. No. 282 §3, 10-14-02) Applications for a building permit may be obtained by leaving a message at City Hall 816-741-0644 or contacting your Alderman

**Dumpster Permit:** is required for all homes in our City. (Ord. no. 359 Section 235.060).

**Note:** Please submit all applications for burn permit or building permit to City Hall 10 days prior to the meeting for consideration. Those applications not received 10 days prior to a meeting will not be considered until the following months City Council Meeting. Applications can be deposited in the mail box at the front of the building. Thank you for your consideration.

### Ordinance 334, Section 230.025 Open Burning for Recreational Purposes

All residents of Houston Lake wishing to apply for an open burning permit can do so by downloading the application on our website [Houstonlake.gov](http://Houstonlake.gov) or you may call city hall and leave your name and phone number. After you have filled out the form, please slip it through the mail slot on the door at City Hall for review and approval by the City Council.

### Fire Danger

Over the years, Kansas City has issued several Red Flag Warnings to alert residents against starting fires. Please pay attention to the local news and refrain from starting any fires.

### **“To All Residents of Houston Lake”**

If any resident needs a trash container or a recycling container, call City Hall 816-741-0644 and leave your name, address, phone number and the containers will be delivered to your home.

### Parking

No vehicle shall be parked on any street within the city limits of Houston Lake, MO. (**Chapter 300 - Schedule II, Municipal Code**)




