#2 Burn Permits - Did you know, if you wish to open burn for recreational purposes, you must renew your burn permit annually. So, if you have any type of fire pit, chiminea, or grill - your approved permit for 2024 is due. You will find the Burn Permit form on the Houston Lake website which is [www.houstonlake.gov](http://www.houstonlake.gov). Then select City Government, then select Forms and Permits. You will find a link to the Burn Permit form under that drop down. ## **FIREWORKS ORDINANCE**

Fireworks Section 210.680 of the Houston Lake Municipal Code states:

It shall be unlawful for any person to use or discharge any “bottle rockets”. It shall be unlawful for any person to use, ignite or discharge any fireworks within the public right of way of any public street. Fireworks may only be used, ignited or discharged at the following times and dates:

1. From 10:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. each day during the period of June twenty-sixth (26) until July second (2nd) and on July fifth (5th); and
2. From 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. (midnight) each day on July third (3rd) and July fourth (4th). No person shall have in his/her possession Division 1.3 (formerly class “B”) fireworks. Division 1.4 (formerly class “C”) fireworks may be possessed during periods herein provided.

## **FISHING AND SWIMMING**

Don't Forget Your Missouri Fishing License and a Houston Lake “2024 Wristband”!!

Lake Residents from the age of 16 through 64 need a Missouri Fishing License and a Houston Lake 2024 Wristband in order to fish in Houston Lake. Residents 65 and over need only a 2024 Wristband. **ABSOLUTELY NO FISHING IN THE BEACH AREA.**

To get your 2024 Wristbands call VGHA Treasurer, Susan Hodges @ 816.786.2377. The Wristbands are FREE if your Homes Association dues are paid. Guests of Residents must have that Residents 2024 Wristband with them when they are on or around the lake and on Homes Association property.

**ATTENTION** Your Lake Dues must be paid to use the lake facilities for swimming, fishing, boating or other recreational purposes even if you have lake front property. Non-paying members may not picnic on Homes Association property (for example, the beach, Mayor's park or the peninsula) you must have your 2024 Lake wristband with you when using the lake.

## **VGHA RULES & REGULATIONS FOR HOUSTON LAKE**

1. Lake tags will be issued to lot owners who have paid their HOA dues in full. Lot owners will be responsible for the wristbands issued to their property.
2. Lake Wristband must be worn and visible for everyone on Venetian Gardens HOA property at all times.
3. Private property. No trespassing. Residents, lot owners and guests only. Violators will be prosecuted.
4. Property owners are responsible for the conduct and actions of their guest at all times.
5. No DIVING or FISHING from the Swimming Docks.

6. No swimming after 9:00p.m.
  7. Alcohol will not be allowed in the beach area.
  8. Animals will not be allowed in the beach area.
  9. Fishing will NOT be allowed ANYWHERE beyond the gate at the swim beach.
  10. No disorderly conduct.
  11. All Rules and Regulations of the Missouri State Conservation Commission will apply.
  12. No trot lines, jug lines or unattended fishing lines are permitted.
  13. All Terrain Vehicles, motor bikes, motor cycles and motor scooters are prohibited from operating on Homes Association property.
- PLEASE NOTE: Houston Lake is dedicated to preventing the spreading of Zebra Mussels. If you want to use any watercraft on Houston Lake, it must be registered with the HOA and tagged (even if it has been in the water for years). If you wish to launch any NEW watercraft on the lake, it MUST be inspected and approved by the HOA. Please contact a HOA Board Member. This process will take at least 10 days, so plan accordingly. You must also have 2024 lake wristband, watercraft safety equipment (life vest) and adhere to lake rules. This applies to NEW boaters. However, safety equipment applies to ALL boaters
- Please, please use your fishing gear safely! Cutting your line loose and leaving long lengths of it in the water can harm our wildlife and our pets, especially if there is still a hook attached.

June has been another busy month for your HOA board.

The beach has been redone. I'd like to thank Drew, Katheryn Krider, Jake Strobbe, Zoah Gay and her friend Autumn, Teena Walker-Robin, and Levee for working with me on the beach. We tilled, removed growth, smoothed, added a truckload of sand and smoothed it out. All the volunteers helped cut the project into about 8 total hours for which I'm incredibly grateful.

Levee is cleaning the beach and swim docks, emptying the trash and dog waste cans on Friday every week. If you see a container that is full, please let me know.

Sue is working with members trying to get accounts up to date. If you are behind on dues, please contact Sue directly to make arrangements to get caught up. Liens will be filed against any homes where the dues are in arrears in August.

The dredging project is entering the final phases. Dredging for the north side of the channel is the last piece to be completed prior to the restoration of the disturbed land areas. I know this has been a long project with many delays, so thank you for your continued patience as this project to save our lake completes.

Jake Strobbe has been working on the back side of the dam, mowing and treating the thistle growing there. The board is working on a plan for the peninsula.




# City Council Meeting Minutes

**Date:** Wednesday, the 8th day of May, 2024

**Location:** Houston Lake City Hall, 5417 NW Adrian, Houston Lake, MO 64151

The regular meeting of the City Council Meeting of Houston Lake, MO, was called to order by Mayor pro tem Ashley Fuglestad at 6:30 p.m.

On roll call, the following members were present: Mayor pro tem / Alderman Ashley Fuglestad, Alderman Sarah Loring, Alderman Teena Walker-Robin, and Alderman Keith Carey

## Approval of Agenda

- Agenda for 05/08/2024 - Walker-Robin moved to approve the agenda by adding adding a Burn Permit for 5404 NW Venetian Dr under Permits and Locks for City Hall under Old Business. Loring 2nd. A voice vote resulted in unanimous approval.
- Minutes -
  - Loring moved to approve the 04/08/24 minutes, Carey 2nd. A voice vote resulted in all Ayes.
  - Walker-Robin moved to approve the 05/03/24 special session minutes, Carey 2nd. A voice vote resulted in Ayes from Carey, Fuglestad, and Walker-Robin. Loring abstained.

## Emergency Management

- Fire Department - Assistant Chief Keith Payne - no calls to report in the last 60 to 90 days. Payne then explained there is a low phone line on Edgewater Trail. This will need to be raised, by the phone company, to a minimum 13' 6" in order to accommodate the new pumper truck. The new truck will be coming within the next two years.
- Sheriff - Captain Woodrow Painter reported three calls for service and three traffic stops. One traffic stop regarded a drunk driver who was arrested and went to jail. Sheriff Dept. officers worked a little over 22.5 hours in April.

## Venetian Gardens Homes Association Report

- The next HOA meeting is scheduled for Monday, May 20 at 6:30 PM.

## Public Discussion

- Sharron DeLaFuenta mentioned the passing of Jan Jackalone on April 27. Jan was a longtime resident of Houston Lake. She served on the City Council for many years and supported the community in many other ways. Ms. DeLaFuenta requested a proclamation from the city in recognition of Jan Jackalone's service to the community to be given to her family. Walker-Robin suggested this might be a resolution. Fuglestad indicated this should be added to the next meeting's agenda.
- Lisa Shepard, new City Clerk, thanked everyone for welcoming her to the position, thanked the council for the new computer, and thanked all for their patience while she is getting acclimated.

## Permits

- Burn - 5400 NW Wagon Trail  
Loring moved to approve the permit pending inspection of the current commercial pit. Walker-Robin 2nd. A voice vote resulted in unanimous approval. Loring will inspect.

- Burn – 5404 NW Venetian Dr  
Walker-Robin moved to approve the permit for the existing home made pit. Loring 2nd. A voice vote resulted in unanimous approval.
- Building – 5404 NW Venetian Dr  
This permit regards replacing a shed that needs repair. Discussion resulted in more information needed before it can be approved.
- Dumpster – 5404 NW Venetian Dr  
This permit regards the shed referenced just above. This permit needs more information before it can be approved.

### Treasurer's Report

Walker-Robin questioned whether or not the Treasurer's Report should be approved since, during past meetings, sometimes this was done and at other times, it was not. Loring moved to approve the Treasurer's Report dated 04/30/24 as submitted. Walker-Robin 2nd. A voice vote resulted in unanimous approval.

### Pay Bills

Walker-Robin moved to approve the May 8, 2024 Pay Bills report as submitted. Loring 2nd. A voice vote resulted in unanimous approval.

### Old Business

1. City Code banning on street parking – next steps
  - Discussion focused on what would be needed, such as substantial signs, in order to remind the community about no parking on the streets. There are multiple steps needed making this a project. It was recommended to move this project to the Project Tracker to identify steps needed to address the parking issues then bring a recommendation to the City Council at a future meeting.
2. Stormwater Grants 2025 including listing and prioritizing opportunities to work with the Platte County Stormwater Grant to address flooding issues – next steps
  - It was recommended to move this project to the Project Tracker to identify steps needed to address the flooding issues then bring a recommendation to the City Council at a future meeting.
3. Parking for residents whose vehicles cannot jump the barrier curb at City Hall during meetings and/or inclement weather – next steps
  - It was recommended to move this project to the Project Tracker to identify steps needed to address the flooding issues then bring a recommendation to the City Council at a future meeting.
4. Missing ordinances & contracts – next steps
  - It was recommended to move this project to the Project Tracker to identify steps needed to locate missing documents then bring a recommendation to the City Council at a future meeting.
5. Abandon the ward system – next steps
  - It was recommended to move this project to the Project Tracker to identify steps needed to address how to update the current ward system then bring a recommendation to the City Council at a future meeting.
6. Platte County Outreach Grant 2024
