

## **Chapter 360**

### **STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING RESTRICTED OR PROHIBITED ON CERTAIN STREETS**

#### **Section 360.010. Application of Chapter.**

The provisions of this Title prohibiting the standing or parking of a vehicle shall apply at all times or at those times herein specified or as indicated on official signs except when it is necessary to stop a vehicle to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a Police Officer or official traffic control device.

#### **Section 360.020. Regulations Not Exclusive.**

The provisions of this Title imposing a time limit on parking shall not relieve any person from the duty to observe other and more restrictive provisions prohibiting or limiting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles in specified places or at specified times.

#### **Section 360.030. Parking Prohibited at All Times on Certain Streets.**

When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets described by ordinance.

#### **Section 360.040. Parking Prohibited During Certain Hours on Certain Streets.**

When signs are erected in each block giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle between the hours specified by ordinance of any day except Sunday and public holidays within the districts or upon any of the streets described by ordinance.

#### **Section 360.050. Stopping, Standing or Parking Prohibited During Certain Hours on Certain Streets.**

When signs are erected in each block giving notice thereof, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle between the hours specified by ordinance of any day except Sundays and public holidays within the district or upon any of the streets described by ordinance.

#### **Section 360.060. Parking Signs Required.**

Whenever by this Title or any ordinance of the City any parking time limit is imposed or parking is prohibited on designated streets, it shall be the duty of the City Traffic Engineer to erect appropriate signs giving notice thereof and no such regulations shall be effective unless said signs are erected and in place at the time of any alleged offense.

#### **Section 360.070. Commercial Vehicles Prohibited From Using Certain Streets.**

In cases where an equally direct and convenient alternate route is provided, an ordinance may describe and signs may be erected giving notice thereof that no persons shall operate any

commercial vehicle upon streets or parts of streets so described except those commercial vehicles making deliveries thereon.

**Section 360.080. Commercial Vehicle Shall Not Be Operated on Prohibited Streets.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or cause to be operated any commercial vehicle upon any street within the City which has been posted with an official sign saying:

"BOULEVARD" or,  
"NO TRUCKS" or,  
"NO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES"

**Section 360.090. Prohibited Parking of Certain Vehicles — Exception — Procedure.**

- A. No person in charge of or owning or operating a motor vehicle commonly known as a one (1) ton pickup or any dual wheel vehicle or any flat bed vehicle or any stake bed bodied vehicle or any bus shall park the same overnight within the City limits of the City of Houston Lake, Missouri.
- B. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (A), a resident of the City of Houston Lake, Missouri, may park a dual wheel one (1) ton pickup truck overnight on such resident's premises, provided such resident first obtains a permit authorizing the parking of such vehicle from the City Clerk. The application for such a parking permit shall contain the following information:
  - 1. The applicant's name and address;
  - 2. A description of the vehicle for which the permit is requested, including make, model and year;
  - 3. The vehicle license number and State of registration;
  - 4. The name and address of the registered owner of the vehicle; and
  - 5. Whether such vehicle is used principally for personal or business purposes.
- C. If it appears from the application that the vehicle is currently registered with the appropriate licensing agency, the City Clerk shall issue a permit authorizing the overnight parking of such vehicle upon the premises of the applicant. The permit shall be valid for a period up to one (1) year and may be renewed for successive one (1) year periods. Provided however, if the vehicle is registered to a person or entity other than the applicant, then the permit shall only be valid for a period of thirty (30) days. Such thirty (30) day permit may be renewed for two (2) successive thirty (30) day periods. Requests for additional renewals must be made to the Board of Aldermen.

- D. In the event the City Clerk denies any application for a parking permit under this Section, the applicant may appeal such denial to the Board of Aldermen of the City of Houston Lake, Missouri. A permit may be revoked by the Board of Aldermen if current State vehicle registration is not maintained or if the permit holder fails to comply with applicable parking restrictions.
- E. This Section shall not apply to vehicles owned by the Missouri Transportation Commission or to vehicles owned by the City of Houston Lake.
