Kansas City Film Producer And Director

Rick Cowan Dies

Longtime Kansas City film [producer and director Rick Cowan](#) died of a heart attack around 2 a.m. on Monday, August 8th, 2016, of Houston Lake. Cowan's wife, Wendy Thompson, announced the news on Facebook.

The two had shared a nice evening together before he started feeling poorly, Thompson tells C J Janovy, for KCUR.

Cowan had worked in Kansas City's film industry since arriving in town in the late 1970s.

"He was so unique, because not only was he a director and producer, he was an actor and a location manager," says Kansas City Film Commissioner Stephane Scupham. "He was a champion for our industry, always advocating for it to be strong and to grow, for all the people in it to be working, and for all of these projects that we can have come to Kansas City."

Cowan was an advisor to the [Kansas City Film Office](#), and had served on the [Missouri Motion Media Association](#) board. In 2014, Scupham says, Cowan accompanied her to Jefferson City to lobby for tax incentives for filmmakers.



He spoke to lawmakers, she says, "from the point of view of somebody who is a full-time freelancer in the industry, because he knew that full-time freelancer is a real career. He was an example of somebody who does that."

"It's a great loss to the Kansas City film community and a deep personal loss for me," says University of Kansas film professor [Kevin Willmott](#), who worked with Cowan on *9th Street*, *CSA: Confederate States of America* and *The Only Good Indian*.

"When I first came back to start making films here, Rick was the key person I met to really help me in my travels," Willmott says. "He was just a really great producer and more than anything a great friend. We talked every day about politics and race and religion and all the things that really mattered in life. It's rare you get to find those people and it was a real honor to get to make films with him."

Cowan was born in Macon, Missouri, and came to Kansas City in the late 1970s, Thompson says. The two met in the mid-1980s at an audition for an Independence Community Theater production of "Our Town."

"He got cast and I did not," Thompson says. "I didn't see him again until I was doing a show in the summer for what used to be Theater Under the Stars outside of Penn Valley Park. I was in a play that was having trouble finding enough men for the cast. He didn't have to audition – he just walked in. We looked at each other and said, 'I remember you.'"

They started dating when the show was over, and the two proceeded on parallel career paths in Kansas City's creative community, Cowan with his film work and Thompson as the creator and owner of [The Mystery Train](#) dinner theater company.

"We were pretty good about bouncing creative ideas off of each other, he was a support person, another voice, another opinion," Thompson says. "Rick was an incredibly smart man."



Publicly, Thompson notes, "he was very irreverent, always had a great sense of humor. He was just a charming man – anybody will tell you that."



But she jokes about what he was like at home.

"I always tell people, 'You think he's a great guy until you live with him. But he's the main source of inspiration when I'm trying to figure out how to kill people in my next play!' He'd laugh about that but sometimes the urge was there! He was a little OCD about a lot of things. He had his quirks and wanted to have control of things, which is why he was a really good producer. And very talented. He had a

very artistic eye and was very articulate."

Besides their common interest in the theater and entertainment, the two developed a love for travel.



He had recently been working on a series of commercials, Thompson says, but had a quiet summer.

"He kind of had hit a little lull and we were planning on taking a trip to Africa next month," she says. "We'd taken a lot of trips and they'd been great. Africa was on his bucket list."





Memories of Rick Cowan

I first met Rick in the parking lot at city hall. He was sorting through a metal locker of fireworks on a very, very hot July day. I could see how hard he was working in that oven of a locker yet, when he saw me walking toward the community garden he stopped to introduce himself. I was curious about what he was doing and with great humor he told me how much he loved to play with fireworks and even the miserable sorting process and safety checks didn't take the fun out of it for him. Our annual fireworks show always impressed me but it was especially fun for me after I'd met Rick and knew how much he loved his "explosive" hobby.

Years later I joined the city council and sat next to Rick at our meetings. He really impressed me with his perspective and sensible approach to issues. Rick was a fun loving, humorous guy, but he took his responsibilities on the council seriously. He readily took on problems and found solutions, and if questions were asked that we couldn't immediately answer he made sure to know the answer by the next meeting. We were very lucky to have Rick in our community, he was a great neighbor, great alderman and a great human being.

Rick Cowan, 60 years old, of Houston Lake, MO. died early on August 8, 2016 at St. Luke's Hospital North of a heart attack. He was born Nov. 23, 1955 in Kirksville, MO to Maxine and Donald Cowan. He grew up in Missouri and attended college briefly at Truman State (then Northeast Missouri State College.) He married Wendy Thompson on March 20, 1988 in Kansas City, MO.

He moved to Kansas City in the late 70s, working in theater as an actor and director, then establishing his career in the film industry as Assistant Director, Location Scout, Production Manager, and Producer. As the Producer of three feature films, he took two of them to the Sundance Film Festival – “CSA: The Confederate States of America” and “The Only Good Indian.” He also produced many, many television commercials, earning an Emmy Award for “When I Grow Up.”

Rick served on the City Council of Houston Lake for over eight years as Alderman and would design and execute the fireworks display for the city's Independence Day Celebration. His passion for his work led him to lobby both state and local governments to promote Kansas City as a place to film. He served on the Advisory Board for the Kansas City Film Commission, as well. For many years, he donated his services as the site manager for Aids Walk Kansas City.

Rick lived life like an artist. He loved traveling, his family, movies, fireworks and discussing politics. All who knew him will miss his irreverent sense of humor, his quick wit, and his generous nature.

He is survived by his wife, Wendy Thompson, three children, Kelley Jones (and Kevin), Jason Thompson, and Season Hansen, six grandchildren, Cassady Thompson (and Haiden Harding), Katie Thompson, Tyson Jones, Nadia Jones, Nevaeh Hanson and Revekah Hansen, one great-grandchild, Elijah Harding, his mother Maxine Cowan of Macon, MO, two brothers, Tracy Cowan (and Jeanne) of Clayton, MO and Doug Cowan (and Carrie) of St. Paul, MN, as well as his aunt and uncle, Carolyn and Harold Sandretto of Green Castle, MO. His father preceded him in death.





Mike Hallauer Honored For Dedicated Community Service at The Missouri Municipal League West Gate Region Civic Leadership Awards

Mike Hallauer, former mayor of Houston Lake, was honored by the West Gate Division of the Missouri Municipal League at its Civic Leadership Award Banquet July 21 in Blue Springs, Missouri.

Mike was appointed Mayor of Houston Lake in February 2004 and served until his retirement in October 2015. He was a tireless leader, always finding ways to help the city's residents and leading with a steady hand.

During Mike's tenure, he balanced a downward spiraling budget and created a financial surplus without raising taxes. Working with community volunteers, he wrote, submitted and implemented grants to build a playground, renovate a bridge, repair a sinkhole, and redesign a street to prevent flooding. He helped build the Mayor's Park and the Community Garden for residents to share and enjoy.

Mike negotiated a Fire Protection contract with the City of Riverside and a Police Protection contract with the Platte County Sheriff's Department, saving the city thousands of dollars. He organized an annual Fall Brush Pick Up and Spring Clean Up and a Curbside Recycling Program to reduce waste going to the landfill.

These words describe Mike: dedicated, hard-working, and caring. He was always the first to arrive and the last to leave. He saw what needed to be done and quietly did it. Whether it was mowing an elderly neighbor's yard or running the city's snowplow in the middle of a blizzard on a cold dark night, we were incredibly fortunate to have his leadership and friendship.
