# **USER INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ENVIRONMENT/ONE GRINDER PUMP**

Our sewage grinder pumps are aging. We are seeing a few more pump failures than we did when our systems were new. We now know there are a few things that can be done to help prevent premature failures. It is recommended that you use a liquid detergent for laundering.

## **CARE AND USE OF YOUR GRINDER PUMP**

The Environment/One grinder pump is capable of accepting and pumping a wide range of materials. Regulatory agencies advise the following items should not, however, be introduced into any sewer, either directly or through a kitchen waste disposal unit: Glass, diapers, socks, rags or cloth, metal, plastic objects (toys, utensils, etc.), seafood shells, sanitary napkins or tampons.

In addition, you must NEVER introduce into any sewer: Explosives, Strong Chemicals, Flammable Material, Gasoline, and Lubricating Oil/Grease

Do not use caustic solutions for drain cleaning. If you must use a drain cleaner, use an enzyme cleaner.

## **PERIODS OF DISUSE**

We have found that in very cold weather, a pump can potentially freeze-up if there is no water usage in the house. If you are going to be gone during the cold weather, we would recommend that you have a friend, neighbor or relative run some hot water down the sink every day or two. This seems to keep the pump from freezing

## **CAUTION: DO NOT DISCONNECT POWER TO THE UNIT**

## **POWER FAILURES**

Your grinder pump cannot dispose of wastewater without electrical power. If electrical power service is interrupted, keep water usage to a **MINIMUM**, please!

The Environment/One Grinder Pump is installed with a warning device. The yellow light should be removed and tested periodically. If you see a yellow pump light on, or the horn blowing on the Southside of the Lake, or if you have any questions about your sewer system, PLEASE call City Clerk ....

One last recommendation – DO NOT run your gutter down spouts or sump pumps into your sewer system. Thank You, City Clerk

# The Wise Old Owl!!

Houston Lake is and always has been a very unique community. Mr. Houston who built Houston Lake wanted this to be a place with flowers growing everywhere, a place where you knew your neighbors and a place everybody was proud to call home.

Back in the 1950's most of the women living here was stay at home mom's. As I understand it on Wednesdays they would go down to the beach talk about various things, drink ice tea and try to cool off as there was basically no air conditioning back then. Somewhere in this time line the Houston Lake Garden Club was organized.

Houston Lake was well known to have some of the best cooks in or around Kansas City. ## **“The Garden Club Did A Lot For Houston Lake**



August 8, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 7:00.

**Minutes:**

The minutes from July 11, 2018 were distributed to the Board. The president asked if there were any corrections. None were noted. The minutes were approved.

**Treasurers report:**

Susan Hodges presented the Treasurer's report and provided the members with the financial statements for June and July 2018.

**New Business:**

Kerry Hallowell gave an overview of the work that needs to be done on the lake. In 2016 the silt pond work was completed. The next step is the horseshoe. Kerry referenced the plan, Houston Lake Observations by Steve Starrett, Ph.D. done in August 2009. If possible, the plan would be to work on the horseshoe project this fall and then dredge in the spring. It was also noted that some members may not understand exactly where the horseshoe is located or understand the erosion problems that exist.

Chuck Stone presented a video/slide show of the horseshoe and explained where it is located. His presentation told of the water coming into the horseshoe not only from the main channel, but also from another source running from 56<sup>th</sup> Street down to the back of the horseshoe. It was noted that the culvert for this run off had been covered up and a new channel had been created but he could not visible trace the water that was coming in to the horseshoe from this source. Chuck commended the forum Houston Lake Recovery & Management Project Forum that Teena Walker Robin created and thanked her for her work.

Kerry Hallowell stated that the Board met with Stinnett Construction, Edwards Construction and one other individual requesting bids on repairing the horseshoe. The plan suggested by the construction companies would be to grade and slope the horseshoe banks to a 3 to 1 or 4 to 1 angle, remove some vegetation and place rip rap on the banks. It was noted that recycled concrete chunks could be used instead of rock which would make the cost less. Kerry also noted that a small silt pond on the back side

of the horseshoe might help. Jake Allman from the Missouri Department of Conservation had suggested that additional silt ponds around the lake would help the siltation problem. Kerry advised the members that she had just received an estimate from Stinnett which was disappointing as it carried a price of \$129,000. No other bids have yet been received.

Jeff Lister said that the Board is in the planning stage and there are other ideas to consider, such as creating a silt pond beginning at the foot bridge, to allow for additional silt to fall out before reaching the main body of the lake. He also noted that perhaps for the dredging, the peninsula could be made into a bowl shape, building up the sides which would make it higher.

Kerry said that the Board was looking into different options for dredging. The Board investigated the services of Dredge America and found that a dredge could be rented for \$15,000 a month. The labor, if provided by Dredge American would cost \$1,500 per day. Alternatively Dredge America would provide a two-day training session to the HOA and we could use volunteer labor to do the dredging. Kerry was not sure how many people could attend the training session. This process would remove approximately 2,500 cubic feet of silt per month.

The issue of the construction site at 56<sup>th</sup> and Northwood was addressed. Kerry said that new siltation fence had been installed after contacting the company. The silt coming in from the site is still of concern.

The members also made other suggestions of things to consider. One was the use of a process which utilizes bags to hold the silt dredged from the lake. The silt is placed in the bags and then the bag permits the water to drain out. The silt dries out in the bag and is then removed.

Teresa Olson contacted a construction company that may have rock. The individual we need to talk to is on vacation until next week.

Joe Chepren advised the Board that it would be a mistake to grade and slope the horseshoe and place rock all along the walls of the horseshoe and remove the vegetation. The vegetation helps the erosion and the rock would eventually erode from the back side. He suggested that the horseshoe be terraced, the vegetation left in place and rock added only to a certain level.

A guest and future HOA member, Mark Enright, also spoke about removing the vegetation. Mark and his family are in the process of purchasing a house on the lake and will close on it soon. He is certified in soil erosion and agreed with Joe that removing the vegetation would be a mistake. He also noted that construction companies are in the business to sell rock and are not engineers or consultants.

Financing the project was also discussed and an increase in dues was suggested.

Jewel Head stated that the horseshoe had washed in previously many times and when that happened equipment was brought in to remove the dirt,

## Use this application to:

1. Register to vote in any election in Missouri.
2. Register to vote when you move from one jurisdiction (St. Louis City, Kansas City, or any county) to another jurisdiction (St. Louis City, Kansas City, or any county) within Missouri.
3. Change the address on a current voter registration when you move within a jurisdiction.
4. Change the name on a current voter registration.

## Other information:

1. You must be 18 years of age by the day of a particular election to be eligible to vote in that election.
2. If mailed, this form must be postmarked by the 4th Wednesday preceding an election to be eligible to vote in that election. If delivered in person, it must be received in the office of the election authority by the 4th Wednesday preceding an election. (See reverse for election calendar.)
3. Submitting this application to an individual other than the election authority does not insure timely voter registration.
4. After the election authority receives your voter registration application, you will be sent confirmation within 7 business days. If you do not receive confirmation, contact the election authority.
5. If you wish to serve as an election judge on election day please contact your local election authority and mark the box at the bottom of this form.
6. Optional—If registering by mail for the first time, please submit a copy of one of the following forms of identification: current or valid photo ID, current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document that shows your name and address, birth certificate, Native American tribal document or other proof of United States citizenship. (You will be required to present identification when you vote.)

## Completing this form (All information is required unless indicated as optional):
