July 4th Fireworks

Section 210.680 of the Houston Lake

Municipal Code states:

It shall be unlawful for any person to use or discharge any "bottle rockets".

It shall be unlawful for any person to use, ignite or discharge any fireworks within the public right of way of any public street.

Fireworks may only be used, ignited or discharged at the following times and dates:

1. From 10:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. each day during the period of June twenty-sixth (26) until July second (2nd) and on July fifth (5th); and

2. From 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. (midnight) each day on July third (3rd) and July fourth (4th).

No person shall have in his/her possession Division 1.3 (formerly class "B") fireworks.

Division 1.4 (formerly class "C") fireworks may be possessed during periods herein provided.

Water test at the Beach Area

Great Plains Analytical Laboratory tested a water sample extracted from the Houston Lake swim dock at the beach area on Wednesday, May 20, 2020 by Sharron DeLaFuente. The water sample was analyzed for both Fecal Coliforms and E. coli. Results conclude that Houston Lake is safe for swimming.

Fecal Coliforms (water) = 22*

E. Coli (water) = 10*

*If the geometric mean of the water quality sample results does not exceed the equivalent of 190 E. coli colonies or fecal colonies per 100 milliliters of water (190 mpn/100 ml), conditions are safe for swimming. Children under 14 years of age require Adult supervision when using the beach area. This is a State Law. Venetian Gardens Homes Ass.

ARTICLE II. PERMITS

SECTION 500.100: BUILDING PERMIT REQUIRED

All persons desiring to construct, erect, alter or add to any building, boat dock, fences, road or drive or any structure in the City of Houston Lake, Missouri, must first obtain a building permit for such construction, alteration or addition from the Board of Aldermen of said City. (Ord. No. 282 §2, 10-14-02)

SECTION 500.110: PERMIT APPLICATIONS

All persons desiring to obtain such a permit shall submit an application with the complete plans and specifications and plot plan for such construction showing sizes, estimated cost and details of such proposed construction and the location of such construction upon the plot of land. No new dwelling construction or property line fence construction will be permitted until after certified surveys have been filed with the Board of Aldermen. Certified surveys will be required on all additions to old dwellings where the new construction will be closer to the property line than the old dwelling. (Ord. No. 282 §3, 10-14-02) Applications for a building permit may be obtained by leaving a message at City Hall 816-741-0644 or contacting your Alderman.

Dumpster Permit: is required for all homes in our City. (Ord. no. 359 Section 235.060).

Note: Please submit all applications for burn permit or building permit to City Hall 10 days prior to the meeting for consideration. Those applications not received 10 days prior to a meeting will not be considered until the following months City Council Meeting. Applications can be deposited in the mail box at the front of the building. Thank you for your consideration.

“To All Residents of Houston Lake”:

If any resident needs a trash container or a recycling container, call City Hall 816-741-0644 and leave your name, address, phone number and the containers will be delivered to your home.

Parking: No vehicle shall be parked on any street within the city limits of Houston Lake, MO. (Chapter 300 - Schedule II, Municipal Code)

All-Terrain Vehicles: No person shall operate an All-Terrain Vehicle upon the streets of this city.(Section 340.110 Municipal Code)

Open Burning Permit for Recreational Purposes

All residents of Houston Lake wishing to apply for an open burning permit can do so by downloading the application on our website Houstonlake.net or you may call city hall and leave your name and phone number. After you have filled out the form, please slip it through the mail slot on the door at City Hall for review and approval by the City Council. (Ordinance 334, Section 230.025)


Fire Danger: Over the years, Kansas City has issued several Red Flag Warnings to alert residents against starting fires. Please pay attention to the local news and refrain from starting any fires.

Fishing: It shall be unlawful for any person to pursue, take, transport, ship, buy, sell, possess or use any fish from any body of water within the City without possessing a valid fishing permit issued by the Missouri Department of Conservation. This section shall not apply to any person 65 years of age or older or is 15 years of age or younger. (Section 210.690 Municipal Code)

DISCHARGING AIR GUN, ETC.Any person within the limits of this City who shall discharge any BB gun, spring gun, paint gun or air gun or shall shoot any pebble, bullet, slug, arrow or other hard substance by means of a sling, crossbow, rubber band or bow or any other means shall be deemed guilty of an ordinance violation; provided however, that this Section shall not apply to any person or organization authorized by the City of Houston Lake to possess and discharge such devices for the purpose of waterfowl pest control. (Ord. No. 303, 9-12-05) (Section 210.285)

Don't Forget Your Missouri Fishing License and a Houston Lake "2020 Wristband"!!



Lake Residents from the age of 16 through 64 need a Missouri Fishing License and a Houston Lake 2020 Wristband in order to fish in Houston Lake. Residents 65 and over need only a 2020 Wristband.

ABSOLUTELY NO FISHING IN THE BEACH AREA.

To get your 2020 Wristbands call Homes Association Treasurer, Susan Hodges @ 816.786.2377.

The Wristbands are FREE if your Homes Association dues are paid.

Guests of Residents must have that Residents 2020 Wristband with them when they are on or around the lake and on Homes Association property.

ATTENTION Your Lake Dues must be paid to use the lake facilities for swimming, fishing, boating or other recreational purposes even if you have lake front property. Non-paying members may not picnic on Homes Association property (for example, the beach, Mayor's park or the peninsula) you must have your 2020 Lake wristband with you when using the lake



Homes Association Rules and Regulations

1. Lake tags will be issued to lot owners who have paid their HOA dues in full. Lot owners will be responsible for the wristbands issued to their property.
2. Lake Wristband must be worn and visible for everyone on Venetian Gardens HOA property at all times.
3. Private property. No trespassing. Residents, lot owners and guests only. Violators will be prosecuted.
4. Property owners are responsible for the conduct and actions of their guest at all times.
5. No DIVING or FISHING from the Swimming Docks.
6. No swimming after 9:00p.m.
7. Alcohol will not be allowed in the beach area.
8. Animals will not be allowed in the beach area.
9. Fishing will NOT be allowed ANYWHERE beyond the gate at the swim beach.
10. No disorderly conduct.
11. All Rules and Regulations of the Missouri State Conservation Commission will apply.
12. No trot lines, jug lines or unattended fishing lines are permitted.
13. All Terrain Vehicles, motor bikes, motor cycles and motor scooters are prohibited from operating on Homes Association property.

PLEASE NOTE: Houston Lake is dedicated to preventing the spreading of Zebra Mussels. If you want to use any watercraft on Houston Lake, it must be registered with the HOA and tagged (even if it has been in the water for years). If you wish to launch any NEW watercraft on the lake, it MUST be inspected and approved by the HOA.

Please contact Jeff Lister at hoacommunications@houstonlake.net. This process will take at least 10 days, so plan accordingly. You must also have 2020 lake wristband, watercraft safety equipment (life vest) and adhere to lake rules.

This applies to NEW boaters. However, safety equipment applies to ALL boaters.

Venetian Gardens Homes Association Meeting

Minutes March 11, 2020

Call to order: Kerry Hallowell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes of the October 16, 2019 meeting were approved as submitted.

Treasurers report:

Susan Hodges provided the members with current financial statements, cash balances and collections.

Meeting:

The first topic discussed was the status of the watershed meetings with respect to the damage caused to the lake by the construction of the school at 56th and Northwood. Jeff said that progress is slow and the committee is not getting any response from the parties involved. The committee is meeting next week. A member asked for the history of events leading up to now, which was provided.

The second topic discussed was Goose Patrol. Kerry brought to everyone's attention that it appeared to be earlier this year because of the weather. She asked members to let us know if anyone sees nests. Last year was a successful year for goose population control and it is hoped that this year will be as well. Jeff then asked if anyone knew of a good welder to repair the aluminum ladder from the swim dock that broke last year. Members provided several referrals.

The third topic discussed was adding sand to the swim beach. Do the members want to add sand? The topic was discussed, along with recommendations to consider in deciding what to do. Nothing was decided during the meeting.

The fourth topic discussed related to the silt that was moved from the lake to the peninsula. The topic was discussed, and the primary concern was keeping the berm intact. The silt is dry on top, but not dry to the middle. The decision was made to let the silt dry longer before moving the silt in bulk.

It was announced that there would be a cleanup day on April 25, 2020. There were various improvement projects suggested. Jeff said they would be prioritized as to need.

It was decided that Sharon DeLaFuente will start water testing in May.

The PortaPotty will be brought back to the beach about May 15, 2020.

Kerry reminded members to call the nonemergency Platte County number if they are concerned about nonmembers using the Lake.

The next meeting is scheduled for April 15, 2020 at 7:00 pm.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m.



Houston Lake is a safe and friendly community. Since the coronavirus pandemic we have seen a lot more outsiders coming in to use the lake.

Houston Lake is a private lake so in order to keep it that way we need everybody living here to help with a neighborhood watch. If you see anybody that you DO NOT know and they are on Homes Association property, please ask them for their 2020 yellow wristband, even if they are boating, fishing or swimming. If you do not want to ask them please call HOA President Kerry Hallowell at 816-695-4100, if you can't reach her then call the Platte County Sheriff Non Emergency Phone number at 816-858-3521.

The City of Houston Lake & The Venetian Gardens Homes Association would like to give a "**Special Thanks**" to all of the residents that are following the rules and guide lines here on the lake. If you are a home owner on the lake and have paid your yearly home owner's dues you get two lake tags to use when you are boating, fishing or swimming.



Boaters: All watercraft must be registered with the Venetian Gardens Homes Association even if they have been in or are currently in the water. Once registered, you will be assigned a number which is to be permanently affixed to the stern of the boat. Please wear your wristband while enjoying the lake.

Maximum Horsepower permissible on the lake will be 7 ½ HP. It is recommended that 3 ½ or 5 HP be used. The maximum speed permissible on the lake by outboards will be FIVE (5) miles per HOUR. NO WAKE.

This applies to NEW boaters. However, safety equipment applies to ALL boaters.

Today, scientists know that zebra mussels can cause increases in toxic blue-green algae, including Microcystis, which produces a poison that causes liver damage when ingested by humans and wildlife. Decaying algae can make waters uninhabitable by causing low levels of dissolved oxygen that result in fish kills.

Zebra mussels have been found in Missouri in Smithville Lake, Lake Taneycomo, Bull Shoals Lake, Lake of the Ozarks, the Missouri River and the Mississippi River. They also occur in Lake Lotawana in the Kansas City area, the lower Meramec River. Invasive zebra mussels now widespread at Truman Lake.



PLEASE NOTE: Houston Lake is dedicated to preventing the spread of Zebra Mussels. The Boat ramp is **closed**.

No watercraft will be allowed in the lake without being inspected. This process will take 10 days so please plan accordingly.

Even if you have lake front property to put your watercraft in you must have it inspected and registered. Now if the watercraft has not left Houston Lake, it does not need to be inspected but it does have to be registered.

Also you must have your 2020 lake wristband on you. Watercraft safety equipment (life vests) and adhere to lake rules. This applies to NEW boaters. However, safety equipment applies to ALL boaters.

Zebra mussels are armed with root-like threads of protein, called "byssal threads," that allow them to firmly attach themselves to hard surfaces such as rocks, native mussels, docks, or boats.

What are they?

Zebra mussels (*Dreissena polymorpha*) are small, freshwater, bivalve shellfish that were likely brought to the U.S. as stowaways in the ballast water of ships. They are native to the Caspian and Black Seas south of Russia and Ukraine, and have since become widespread in both Europe and the U.S.

They are easy to identify, with a distinct, flat-bottomed 'D' shape to their shells that allows them to sit flat against a solid surface, and black, zigzag stripes against a cream background that earned them their name. They grow around two inches long at most, and are microscopic in their larval stage, which is known as a "veliger." They are short-lived (between two and five years), and begin reproducing at two years of age. Each female can release up to a million eggs per year.

Economic impacts

"Biofouling," or the accumulation of adult zebra mussels on surfaces put in the water, is one of the more notable impacts zebra mussels can have on a local economy. Zebra mussels are armed with rootlike threads of protein, called "byssal threads," that allow them to firmly attach themselves to hard surfaces such as rocks, native mussels, docks or boats.

Typically, this isn't a problem for boats that are only in the water for short trips, but boats, docks or intake pipes that are left in the water for a long period of time can become encrusted and be very difficult to clean. If a boat owner also fails to drain the water from his or her motor, any veligers floating in the water will root themselves and clog the machinery as they reach adulthood.

Environmental impacts

Biofouling is a problem in the ecological world as well. Zebra mussels will attach to native mussels much like they do docks, and in large enough numbers can prevent the natives from moving, feeding, reproducing, or regulating water properly. The zebra mussels also outcompete the natives for food and space, and because of their fast reproduction can quickly overwhelm a water system.

The feeding habits of zebra mussels can also have a drastic impact on an infested lake. Zebra mussels are filter feeders that siphon particles of plankton from the water. They are highly efficient at this, and a large population of mussels can quickly clear the water of almost all floating particles. This change can cause shifts in local food webs, both by robbing food from native species that feed on plankton and also by increasing water clarity and thus making it easier for visual predators to hunt.

Where are they now?

Zebra mussels were first discovered in the U.S. in the late 1980s. The first established population was discovered in 1988 at Lake St. Clair, which straddles the border between the U.S. and Canada and which connects to Lake Erie and Lake Huron. They quickly spread across the Great Lakes, and are now present in the Mississippi and St. Croix Rivers as far north as Stillwater. Human transport has now spread them to the west coast of the U.S.

How do we stop them?

Once a population of zebra mussels has become established in a water body, there is very little to be done to remove them.

Prevention, therefore, is the best way to keep a water body clean of zebra mussels. Because they reproduce by spewing veligers into the water, zebra mussels are dependent on a current to spread their populations. This means that they can only move downstream in a river, and need a ride if they are to move further upstream.

Humans often aid them in their spread by transporting water from place to place. The microscopic veligers are invisible to the naked eye, and infected water transported in the bottom of a boat, inside a motor or via a livewell can readily become a new infestation if released into an otherwise clean river or lake. To prevent this, boaters must take care to drain their boats, motors and livewells before leaving a lake or river, wash their boat and trailer thoroughly, and allow it to dry for at least five days (the amount of time a zebra mussel can survive out of water) before taking the boat out again.

Since 1992, the National Park Service at the St. Croix National Scenic Riverway has led the efforts designed to halt or slow the spread of zebra mussels. Public education and information, access management, monitoring, and research are all tools in this effort. These tenacious animals have colonized the St. Croix River from the Mississippi upstream to the city of Stillwater. Threats from colonies in lakes near the Namekagon River are worrisome. Boats must take precautions to prevent further infestation.
